**CANNON BALLS!

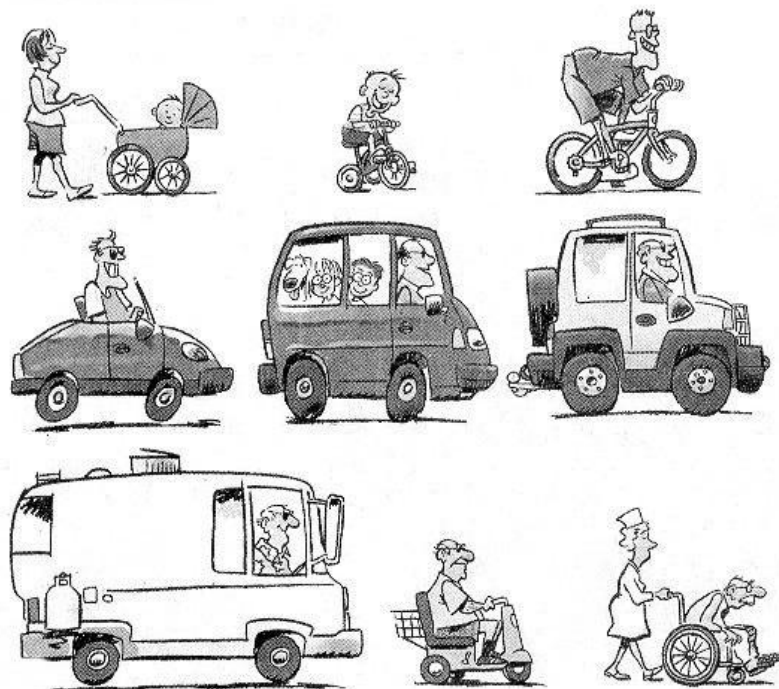
