SEALEY CUP HANDICAP SINGLES

Saturday 20th and Sunday 21st April
(And possibly Saturday 27th April)

This year there have been a lot of changes to this event. It is now a MIXED knockout event with all games played over 18 ends instead of 21 up. In an effort to increase the number of participants we have already done a draw where EVERYONE HAS BEEN INCLUDED. (If you do not want to play then you have to remove your name from the draw instead of the usual method of entering.)

We hope most of you will play and that no-one gets to the final without playing a game!!!

The HANDICAP SYSTEM has also been changed since last year. Everyone has been allocated a handicap between 0 and 14 by the male and female selectors with the intention of trying to make it fair and rank everyone on the same system. The best players have been handicapped at zero and the rest ranging out to the lowest on 14. To better understand this let's assume the lowest handicap player is playing the highest handicapper. Before the game starts each handicap is written on the card so the lesser player effectively has already scored 14 while the better player is still on 0. They then play 18 ends and the leader at that stage is the winner. This system has the advantage that all games are of approximately the same length, and it gives everyone a fair chance as the better players have a limited number of ends to catch up the starting deficit. (The results of this year's games and comparison between each gender will give the selectors some information when they set next year's handicaps.) This system was copied from Millicent, Penola and Kingston who all find it a good method with quite a few games finishing as a draw and needing an extra end.
