## PRESIDENTS REPORT

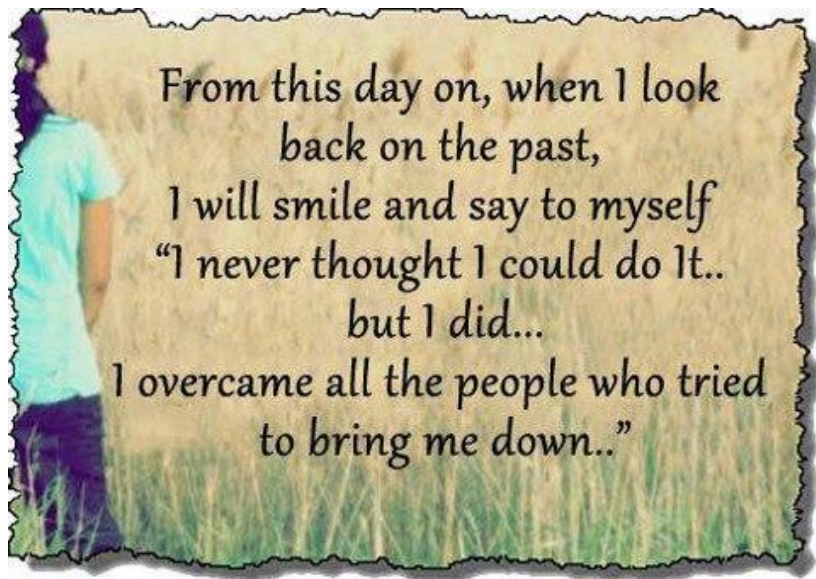

## STICKY DATE PUDDING

175g (6 oz) pitted dates, chopped  
1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda  
60 g (2 oz) butter, softened  
¼ cup caster sugar  
2 eggs, lightly beaten  
1 ½ cups SR Flour  
½ teaspoon vanilla essence

### SAUCE

125g (4 oz) butter, cubed  
¾ cup lightly packed brown sugar  
200ml cream

Preheat oven to 180 C. Grease an 18cm (7") square cake tin and line with baking paper. *(I use Muffin Tins for small individual serves and they can be frozen and pulled out when unexpected guests come.)*

Place dates in a bowl, add carb soda and pour over 300ml of boiling water, set aside. Beat the softened butter and caster sugar until pale and fluffy. Add beaten eggs, a bit at a time, beating well after each addition. Sift in the flour. Add the dates and their juice, then the vanilla and mix well. This will be a wet mixture. Pour into the prepared tin and bake for 35-45 minutes, or until risen and firm to touch. A skewer inserted in the centre should come out clean. Meanwhile, make the sauce by placing the butter, brown sugar and cream in a small saucepan. Bring to the boil and simmer for 5 minutes. Turn the pudding out of the tin and place on a baking tray. Pour one-third of the sauce over the pudding and return it to the oven for 5 minutes, or until golden and bubbling. This gives the pudding a delicious hot caramel topping. Cut the pudding into squares and serve topped with the remaining sauce, plus cream or ice cream. Serves 6-8 **Yummy!**
